Kim Marshall began his career in 1969 teaching sixth graders in a Boston middle school. During Boston's desegregation crisis in the mid-1970's, Kim became increasingly involved in schoolwide change efforts, delved into the new research on effective urban schools. Later Kim worked in the district's central office, first as a policy advisor and speechwriter for Superintendent Robert Spillane, then leading a team that wrote new curriculum objectives for the district, and finally serving as director of curriculum and planning.

In 1987, Kim finally got his wish and was made a principal of the Mather Elementary School for the next 15 years. Kim now works for New Leaders for New Schools (www.nlms.org), a non-profit that recruits, trains, and supports urban principals. Kim coaches new principals in New York City, with a special focus on improving teacher supervision and evaluation and the effective implementation of interim assessments. He has published numerous articles on education and particularly evaluation. His Marshall Memo is widely read and appreciated.
